How to Register for TLC?

Many international students want to register for The Language Connection (TLC), but some students don't know how to register because it may be difficult for them. The students can register before the session begins via online or by paper in the TLC office. Registration is important because students can't study without registering for classes.

I asked Miss. Tiecher, who is responsible for registration, a few questions about this. She said that it costs "\$125 for university fee, \$1,950 for a session, [and some students who have a scholarship] have [to take an] elective class, [which costs an extra] \$325."

She thinks "either way is easy, online or by paper." She told me that "of course, the registration is very easy for TLC." She stated that "the largest number of students in the TLC there are 80 students." Miss. Tiecher says "if you have questions or you want any help! You can come to the office or send me an email [adamst@stjohns.edu] about your questions."


There are two ways to register:




St. John's University, Queens Campus Buildings
