## Eligibility

College students who have genuine interest in attending law school and becoming lawyers, a grade point average of 3.0 or better, have completed between 45 and 75 college credits as of June 4, 2007 and who are either low-income or first-generation college students or members of a group underrepresented in law school education are eligible.
