The Clinical Development Major Depressive Disorder (MDD) Pharmaceutical Industry Fellowship is a postgraduate experience for individuals who have earned a Doctor of Pharmacy degree. The fellowship provides hands-on experience in clinical development of special population clinical studies (Phase 1) and late phase (Phase 3) clinical studies to support the filing of a new drug application for a MDD pharmaceutical.

The fellowship combines clinical development experience with broader development exposure to regulatory, quality, nonclinical, and CMC (i.e., chemistry, manufacturing, and controls), to introduce and develop valuable skills in the overall investigational new drug development pathway.

During this unique fellowship, you use your skills to make a positive impact on the advancement of a therapeutic modality for treatment of MDD and establish strong working relationships with health economics and outcomes research, medical, regulatory, quality, and clinical development functions.

At the completion of the fellowship, you will be able to

- Build and maintain expertise in clinical trial execution and oversight, including the management of vendor partners.
- Gain proficiency in conducting comprehensive literature searches.
- In collaboration with clinical project managers and medical leads, conduct data review for clinical data including patient profiles and aggregate data evaluation including trend analysis.
- Lead the timely development of core clinical development documentation, including but not limited to clinical protocol(s), clinical study reports, development safety update reports, informed consent(s), and investigator brochures.
- Manage clinical studie(s) within established timelines and budget.
- Understand the overall investigational new drug development pathway, including but not limited to regulatory, quality, CMC, medical, and health economics and outcomes research.
- Attend professional meetings, as well as internal business meetings, with travel, attendance, and associated costs reimbursed dependent on active research dissemination and business objectives and needs.
- Develop effective teaching and research skills.

ELIGIBILITY:

Potential applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Graduate from an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Educationaccredited Doctor of Pharmacy program
- Demonstrate genuine interest in a career in the pharmaceutical industry
- Be eligible to work in the United States
