The Academic Task Force was created in September to work with the community during this transition.

The committee was charged with he following:

- To create a timeline reflecting the steps that should be taken over the two year teach out plan
- To act in response to student academic matters that may arise over the course of the two-year teach out period and work
 with the dean's to appropriately advise students.
- To work on establishing classes to be offered in the Summer of 2023 and communicate those offerings to students.
- To establish a working group that can focus on students services and report back to the task force on what students require for the next two years
- To prioritize and elevate concerns from faculty, administrators and staff to the group for resolutions
- To plan the transition of Staten Island students to the Queens campus at the end of the two year teach out period and
 continue to be a resource to the students and faculty members, administrators, and staff once settled at the Queens campus

 - 737 total recipients
 - 46 survey responses by February 12

- Sent a request to the faculty from the Provost's to remind students to take the survey sent on **Monday, February 13**
 - Additional 75 responses




Results:

- Unique responses verified with signon




What is your class year as of the Spring 2023 semester?






Please indicate your current school/college.






Are you interested in taking classes during the summer of 2023 on the Staten Island campus?






Have you ever visited the St. John's Queens campus?






Of those who had never visited the Queens campus:

Would you be interested in participating in a group tour of the Queens campus?






Do you intend to be a St. John's Queens campus student as of Fall 2024?

Please select from any of the following reasons why you do not intend to be a Queens campus student as of Fall 2024.






Other responses:
