Journalists are the chroniclers of today and the historians of tomorrow. They play a vital role in how the public perceives local, national, and international events. Journalists also provide information that is essential for educated citizens in a democracy.

Now you can become part of this rewarding field by earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Journalism.

WHAT CAN I DO WITH A B.S. IN JOURNALISM?

A journalism degree from St. John's prepares you for jobs in virtually every news outlet in the mass communications industry: newspapers, wire services, magazines, television, radio, Internet sites, public relations, advertising, and corporate relations.

You learn to write quickly and well, research and gather facts, work with people and interview them—skills that are useful in virtually every field.

St. John's journalism graduates work for such major outlets as the *New York Times*, *Newsday*, *New York Daily News*, *El Diario*, the Associated Press, Fox News, CBS, NBC, ABC, and *Fortune* magazine.

They also write and edit corporate communications for Fortune 500 companies. Younger graduates starting their journalism careers often find jobs in smaller news organizations. Most journalists work their way up from small companies to large-market broadcast and cable stations, big-city newspapers, and Internet news sites. Emphasizing hands-on experience, St. John's journalism program offers extensive internship opportunities. Student interns receive academic credit for their work at approved professional newspapers, wire services, Internet news sites, radio and television stations, public relations firms, and advertising agencies.

Students intern at local and major media in and around New York City including the *New York Daily News*, *Newsday*, *Queens Tribune*, *Queens Ledger*, *Amsterdam News*, *Broadcasting and Cable* magazine, WOR radio, WFAN radio, Westwood One Sports Radio, WABC-TV, WNBC-TV, MTV, and *The Onion* news website.
