ABOUT THE HEALTHCARE INFORMATICS PROGRAM

As the healthcare industry expands its use of technology to improve the delivery and quality of patient information, the demand for credentialed healthcare information technology specialists is surging. Combining computer science and healthcare expertise, “informaticians” work with electronic medical record systems, create healthcare information management software, and help develop cost-effective, high security, comprehensive patient information databases—all crucial to the seamless functioning of the nation’s healthcare system.

Healthcare has been one of the fastest-growing IT markets worldwide in recent years. The Bureau of Labor Statistics forecasts that employment in the healthcare sector—nearly one-sixth of the US economy—will continue to surge. Job growth will be particularly strong in hospitals, followed by medical offices, insurance companies, and medical and IT consulting companies. Opportunities will be greatest for those with managerial skills.

You can prepare for this cutting-edge career through the new Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Informatics at St. John’s University. Offered by the College of Professional Studies at St. John’s, the program responds to the growing national demand for healthcare information technology specialists.

THE PROGRAM

The four-year, 126-credit program includes 18 credits in computer science fundamentals, 18 credits of specialized courses in healthcare informatics, and 18 credits in health services administration, enabling students to graduate with both a major in healthcare informatics and a minor in health services administration.
