The Psychology Department offers an undergraduate major as part of the Bachelor of Arts degree in St. John's College of Arts and Sciences. The Department also offers several combined BA / graduate programs in five years. These include a combined:

- BA (Psychology) / MA in Experimental Psychology;
- BA (Psychology) / MA in Criminology & Justice
- **And the NEW BA (Psychology) / MBA program in cooperation with St. John's Tobin College of Business**

The objectives of the psychology department are: to provide students with a sound preparation in psychology, appropriate to their level (i.e., undergraduate or graduate); to stress the scientific foundations of the discipline, so that students gain an understanding of the psychological, social, and biological processes underlying normal and abnormal behavior; to foster students' ability to think critically and to integrate theory with research; and to intensify the discovery and understanding of the interaction of human behavior. In its professional programs, the department has the added objective of fostering the highest standards of professional practice and ethical conduct.

Undergraduates can participate as research assistants in ongoing research projects being conducted by faculty members in the department. In the past, many students have presented their research at Psychology Conferences and in some cases, they have co-authored a published article based on their research participation.

¹ Please remember that if you are planning to do study abroad and take our Discover the World Psychology you should plan not to take the courses offered in Discover the World in Queens or Staten Island.

² If you wish to study abroad in the Discover the World Psychology DO NOT do this in a fall semester. The fall course in this program are (Starting in 2013) are Psy 2070 Child Psychology & Psy 3320 Social Psychology. If you enrolled study abroad in the FALL semester, you would not be able to complete the BA/MA because both of the study abroad courses are course that you do not take and you take graduate courses instead and use the graduate courses to meet these undergraduate requirements.

³ Because most courses are three (3) credits, students may need to take 30 credits of electives to reach the 28 credits specified in this category. Thus, students can end up with 128 credits rather than 126. If you have taken any elective course that are more than three (3) credits, or transferred a course that is more than three (3) credits, you will not have to take the additional two (2) credits.
