LL.M./J.D. Transfer Students

The LL.M./J.D. program allows for a select group of St. John's Law LL.M. graduates to continue on to receive the J.D. degree, with the LL.M. year counting as free electives towards the J.D. A full-time student in the program completes both degrees in a total of three years. (The LL.M. is awarded after the first year; the conferral of the J.D. degree occurs two years after that, once the student has completed all of the requirements of the J.D. program.) The program provides students with a deeper understanding of American law and opens up the option of taking the bar exam in any U.S. state.

Students who participate are transfer students and are not required to take the LSAT or GRE.

Application Requirements

A student in the TLP or USLS LL.M. program applies for admission to the J.D. during the final semester of his or her LL.M. studies. Students are typically on pace to complete their LL.M. degree with a minimum GPA of 3.6. All applicants will be reviewed by the J.D. Admissions Committee, and a decision will be made after the application is complete and all final grades are received. As part of the application, students must submit:

- St. John's transcript from the LL.M. program
- Two letter of recommendation, one of which is written by a faculty member not affiliated with the LL.M. programs
- Personal Statement outlining why the applicant wishes to pursue the J.D. degree
- Resume
- Letter from a representative of the Office of Graduate Studies stating that you are in good standing and which credits would be eligible to transfer to the J.D. program

Undergraduate Transcript Requirements

Incoming students must provide official transcripts from all previous colleges and universities attended, including a final transcript showing conferral of an undergraduate degree by September 1, if one is not already on file with St. John's Law Graduate Studies Office. Pursuant to the American Bar Association Standards and Rules of Procedure for Approval of Law Schools, students who do not submit such transcripts by October 15th of their year of enrollment will be withdrawn from the program, unless the Law School, through the Assistant Dean for Students, grants a reasonable extension for extraordinary circumstances where, through no fault of the student, he or she was unable to procure a transcript in time. If such extraordinary circumstances are present, documentation will be placed in the student's file.

Bar Admission

Applicants who intend to practice law should be aware that admission to the bar in all states involves character, fitness and other qualifications. Applicants are encouraged to determine what those requirements are in the state(s) in which they intend to practice by consulting the website of the National Conference of Bar Examiners at www.ncbex.org. Applicants to law school should contact the official bar admission agency in the jurisdiction where they plan to practice. Initially, it is important to determine if there is a requirement to register with the agency upon entrance to law school in anticipation of applying to take a bar examination upon graduation. To prepare themselves accordingly, applicants also are advised to familiarize themselves with the rules governing admission to the bar in the jurisdictions in which they intend to practice. For those applicants who anticipate admission to the New York Bar, please be advised that you are not required to contact the State Board of Law Examiners prior to commencing law school.

International Students

If you are accepted into the Law School and have entered the US on a B-1, B-2, or F-2 visa, or in undocumented status, St. John's University School of Law cannot allow you to register for class until your visa status is changed to F-1 (international students with permission to enter the U.S. for academic purposes only). If you are not a permanent resident and plan to apply for F-1 student visa status (Form I-20), please select F-1 for Visa Type when completing your application.
