Curriculum Requirements for Student Advising

General Requirements

- 24 credits (required & elective) minimum of in-class coursework
- Minimum GPA of 2.1 upon graduation
- Complete degree within 2 years (24 months) of beginning program
- Students with F-1 visa must enroll full-time.

Course Requirements

- Introductory course:**
 - Introduction to United States Law & Lawyering (3 credits)

- Writing Requirement¹:**
 - First semester: Legal Research, Analysis & Writing for LL.M. I (3 credits) AND
 - Second Semester: Legal Research, Analysis & Writing for LL.M. II (2 credits)
 - Optional advanced: Legal Research, Analysis & Writing for LL.M. III (2 credits)

- TLP Fall Semester Core Requirements:**
 - International Law (3 credits) AND
 - Transnational Legal Practice Skills – International Law (1 credit)

- TLP Spring Semester Core Requirements:**
 - International Business Transactions (3 credits) AND
 - Transnational Legal Practice Skills – International Transactions (1 credit)

- Free electives, as approved**

¹ Students who are native or bilingual English users, or who have written academic papers extensively in English may request a waiver from Legal Research, Analysis & Writing I. Placement in writing class is at the judgment of the Director of Graduate Academic Programs with advice and approval from the Vice Dean for Administration.
