The U.S. Constitution is the oldest and shortest written Constitution of any major government in the world. It contains only 4,400 words.

The most iconic opening "We the people of the United States..." was actually used at the last minute. In earlier drafts it read "We the people of the states of..." (the individual states were listed from the north to the south).

Jefferson and John Adams, were unable to attend the Constitutional Convention and did not sign the actual document.




Behjamin Franklin, known as the "first American," was the oldest American to sign the Constitution at the age of 81. It has been said that he needed help signing and as he did there was tears running down his face.

Many know of the Bill of Rights but do not know that they are actually not in the original document. They are, in fact, the first 10 amendments which were presented by James Madison in a series of legislative articles.

The original Constitution is in a display case at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. The cases contain argon gas and are kept at 67 degrees Fahrenheit with a relative humidity of 40% to preserve the parchment papers.
