B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ST. JOHN'S UNIVERSITY

For admission into the St. John's Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Human Services, Human Services Concentration, Guttman Community College graduates must:

- Submit a completed admission application to the Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Human Services, Human Services Concentration.
- Be awarded the Associate of Arts degree in Human Services from Guttman Community College with minimum cumulative and major GPAs of 2.0.
- Submit all, final, official transcripts. The Guttman transcript must indicate the date of degree conferral.

To take advantage of this articulation agreement, students must follow the course-by-course guidelines outlined in this agreement. Students must be awarded the Associate in Arts in Human Services from Guttman Community College with minimum and cumulative GPAs of 2.0, have not attended another higher education institution after graduation and be accepted as a transfer student into the B.S. program in Health and Human Services, Human Services Concentration, at St. John's University. Students are required to complete transfer coursework with minimum grade requirements as outlined in Part D: Transfer Credits Awarded

Students who attend another higher education institution after completion of A.A. degree at Guttman Community College who then seek admission to St. John's will receive admission consideration under St. John's standard transfer policies.

Incoming transfer students will follow the requirements for the B.S. in Health and Human Services, Human Services Concentration in effect for the term of their enrollment in St. John's University, even if the new requirements are different from what are found in this agreement. Responsibility for knowing and fulfilling all degree requirements rests with the individual student. This responsibility will be communicated to students by Guttman Community College.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: 54

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 66

Total credits required for the St. John's University's baccalaureate degree: 120

C. TRANSFER CREDITS AWARDED

Guttman Community College graduates who are awarded the Associate of Arts degree in Human Services and follow the course-by-course guidelines outlined on the following pages and meet all noted grade requirements, will receive 54 credits toward the Bachelor of Science degree in Health and Human Services, Human Services Concentration. Students are required to submit all final, official transcripts before transfer credits can be applied to the B.S. degree at St. John's. The Guttman transcript must indicate the date of degree conferral.

Grade Requirements:

- Courses completed at Guttman Community College as part of the associate degree require grades of “D” or better to be eligible for transfer credit.
- Credits that were earned at another institution, including those applied to the AA degree, require grades of “C” or better to be eligible for transfer credit. If credits were transferred into Guttman, St. John's will require all college transcripts from the external College(s) for review.
- Courses with pass/fail grades are not transferable to the BS degree.
