

New Student and Family Orientations

This is a time when our University family comes together to welcome you to our community. Family Orientation is designed to help your family learn more about our programs and services. It is also a valuable opportunity to meet the academic School/College deans and representatives from University offices.

First-Year Mentoring

Having a peer mentor as a first-year student can help you navigate college life. Mentoring programs include E.P.I.C. (Establish Relationships, Promote Possibilities, Impact Direction, and Confirm Next Steps) and the R.I.S.E. Network (Reach, Inspire, Succeed, and Empower).

These programs pair students with experienced mentors who provide personalized guidance, share valuable insights, and offer unwavering support. Our mentorship programs are here to help students build confidence, develop essential skills, and achieve their goals!

E.P.I.C.

The goal is to create a community where first-year students learn from the guidance and wisdom of sophomores, juniors, or seniors who have successfully navigated their first year in college.

R.I.S.E. Network

This program is designed to provide you with individualized mentorship and guidance. With an emphasis on reaching first-year students who may need help adjusting to the academic and social demands of college, it promotes leadership skills, goal setting, financial literacy, character building, and career skills. Their approach is student centered and focuses on each network scholar through peer mentoring and programming geared toward the needs of first-generation college students.

Residence Life

University housing is home to a diverse array of students, faculty, and administrators across the country and around the world. Residents enjoy convenient access to everything St. John's has to offer, including free laundry service, Wi-Fi, streaming television and movies, meal plans, athletic facilities, recreational opportunities, and a variety of exciting programs.



Center for Student Success

The Center for Student Success is a one-stop hub of resources for first-year students, inclusive of academic and career advising, academic achievement resources and tutoring, care resources, and other first-year transition programs. Administrators foster a safe and supportive community of belonging that provides an opportunity for you to succeed personally and professionally.

Academic Advising

The Academic Advising team helps you build a foundational understanding of how to plan and navigate your academics and campus life at St. John's, including understanding graduation requirements and the many online student tools available to you.

Academic Achievement Support

Need help with a class? The Academic Achievement team supports you with your courses by providing both overall academic skill and content-specific assistance. Programs include academic strategy sessions, peer tutoring, self-paced online modules, skills labs and collaboratives, and workshops.

Student Success Programs

The programs team focuses on helping you thrive academically, personally, and professionally. Learning how to build relationships with the University, with professors, and with each other is an important skill to develop. Our programs are designed to strengthen your ability to connect with the St. John's community, with a focus on building strategies to enhance your academic skills.

- **Jumpstart Your Johnnie's Journey** (summer bridge program)
- **This Thursday Series** is a weekly student gathering that includes learning, active engagement, and resources.
- **Notebook Network** is an opportunity for students to be paired with another first-year pen pal. Students share a notebook, and respond to weekly prompts as they experience their first year at St. John's.
- The **First-Year Research Opportunity** program provides an experiential introduction to student-faculty research.
- **Phi Eta Sigma** is the first-year student honor society.

Career Advisement: Major Exploration

A team of University Career Services advisers can be found within the Center for Student Success. They encourage you to connect for support and guidance in exploring majors and career pathways, and to begin building foundational career readiness skills.

Office of Parent and Family Connections

Families are integral members of our University community and our partner in every student's college experience. To provide families with campus connections, the Office of Parent and Family Connections is their go-to resource for when they feel students need extra support or for when they have a question or concern.

Compass is our St. John's University Parent and Family communications portal where families receive the latest St. John's news and updates designed specifically for parents and families. Family newsletters and a helpful family webinar series every semester keep families well informed of campus happenings and opportunities. Our new biweekly "Coffee & Conversation" office hours provide easy access to our office.

From welcoming new families at Family Orientation to hosting StormFest—our annual combined Family Weekend and Homecoming fall festival—to celebrating our graduates at our Family Graduate Celebration, the Office of Parent and Family Connections serves our St. John's families throughout their Johnnie's journey. Office of University Mission

This office is dedicated to the examples of St. Vincent de Paul and St. Louise de Marillac, who based their ministry on helping those most in need. At St. John's, our students serve in communities locally, nationally, and globally. Gaining direct, shared experience through helping others, Johnnies are uniquely prepared to serve as ethical leaders.

Department of Student Wellness

- **Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS)**, staffed by a team of psychologists, social workers, and licensed mental health counselors, as well as a part-time psychiatrist, offers free and confidential mental health services to St. John's students. There are no session limits or waiting lists, and a clinician is always available to meet with a student in need of immediate support. In addition, a Mental Health Helpline is available to students 24/7.
- **Student Health Services** provides medical services similar to community urgent care to all St. John's students 24 hours a day, seven days a week, with no insurance required. Our team of dedicated, Board-certified family nurse practitioners and registered nurses provide sick care; first aid; on-site testing for strep throat, COVID-19, influenza, and urinary tract infections and referrals for imaging services (e.g., X-rays, ultrasound) and local primary care providers or specialists for chronic disease management. Student Health Services also hosts annual influenza vaccination clinics.
- **Student Accessibility Services**. Did you know that not all disabilities are visible? Learning, emotional, and/or neurological issues and chronic illnesses can make it challenging to thrive in college. Student Accessibility Services provides classroom, testing, and housing accommodations for students with physical, learning, emotional, or temporary disabilities to help them succeed.

- **Campus Recreation (CREC)** is comprised of Taffner Field House and the Fitness Center in Carnesecca Arena. It provides opportunities to be active, get healthy, meet friends, and get involved on campus. Each week, CREC offers about 20 fitness classes, including meditation, pilates, Sculpt®, Spin®, yoga, and Zumba®, as well as low cost personal training. CREC has an active intramural program, including basketball, dodgeball, flag football, soccer, softball, and volleyball.
- **Wellness Education and Prevention** provides you with skills and strategies to thrive academically, socially, and emotionally. We offer large-scale, signature events such as the annual Wellness and Suicide Prevention Walk. You can join the team of Wellness Peer Educators and help teach the St. John's community about such topics as getting a good night's sleep, managing stress, and connecting with others on campus. We also offer services such as wellness coaching (where goals are set to improve a specific area of wellness) and Brief Alcohol Screening and Intervention for College Students (BASICS) appointments, which allow you to explore your own alcohol and drug use behaviors in a judgment-free environment.
- The **Sexual Violence Outreach, Awareness, and Response (SOAR)** office works to prevent and reduce the traumatic impact of sexual and dating violence and stalking. Training is offered on affirmative consent, bystander intervention, and healthy relationships to provide you with the tools you need to build safe and equitable relationships and safely intervene in potentially harmful situations. Additional supportive programming, including free weekly gentle yoga classes, expressive arts workshops, and restorative justice Survivor Community Circles, is also available. Any student impacted by sexual or dating harm, unsure of something that happened to them, or curious if their relationship is healthy can receive confidential support from the Campus Support Adviser. They can share their experience, ask questions, and receive support, including with the reporting process; requesting academic or housing accommodations; and connecting to mental health, medical, and legal services.


College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences






Innovation Investing in the Future

The Homeland Security/ Emergency Management Simulation Lab

creates, simulates, and escalates a variety of large-scale incidents, either natural or manmade, including floods, landslides and mudslides, terrorist attacks, structural collapse, weapon of mass destruction and nuclear strikes, wildfires, civil disorder, hazardous material and biological releases, and severe weather conditions, such as hurricanes or tornadoes—all in a realistic, physics-based environment.

The Cybersecurity Lab

provides you with the opportunity to learn, apply, and practice cybersecurity by working with software and employing techniques for intrusion detection, vulnerability mitigation, network perimeter defense, incident response, network forensics investigation, and malware analysis.





Anatomage Tables

Students in the College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences gain a deeper understanding of human anatomy through Anatomage® virtual dissection tables—the most technologically advanced virtual dissection table for anatomy education. Through virtual reality, you examine and tour the human body.

The Lesley and William Collins Business Analytics Lab

boasts state-of-the-art learning tools, including 40 computer workstations. Every computer is equipped with the latest FactSet financial workstation software and some computers are also Bloomberg terminals. These software tools and databases provide access to financial markets information, financial statement data, news, and worldwide economics indicators to enrich every student's understanding of the business world. Classes can monitor and discuss the latest financial news and information with DIRECTV channels including Bloomberg, CNBC, FOX Business, and other cable news channels.



The Venture & Innovation Center

fosters a culture of collaboration and entrepreneurship and provides significant support to new ideas and businesses. It offers a range of services and programs, such as advisement, mentoring, and program support.

The Drs. E. Lawrence and Adele V. Deckinger Center for Integrated Advertising Communications

a specialized learning space modeled after a typical advertising agency, gives you a preview of careers in the field and invaluable experiential learning opportunities. It features a touch-screen computer center with state-of-the-art Mac stations, Cintiq drawing monitors, format printers, writeable walls, and multiple video display screens.



The Media Arts and Design Lab

known as the MAD Lab, is a destination for students choosing to study advertising, animation, digital media, graphic design, illustration, mass communication, photography, public relations, and television and film. The lab includes professional-level Mac Pro workstations with Cintiq tablets—which are used in 3D modeling, illustration, and retouching photographs. In the adjacent Technology Commons, students studying 3D modeling can have their design prototypes 3D printed.

Leadership

Developing leadership skills and participating in community service are essential components to the educational experience and lead to greater personal enrichment and academic success.

Leadership Development supplements St. John's University's mission by providing programs, services, and mentorship opportunities that assist and enhance personal growth, decision making, civic responsibility, and leadership advancement and training.

The **Career Peer** program offers you the unique opportunity to become an integral part of a team that helps guide, educate, and promote career readiness and development to other St. John's students. Working to support the University and department missions, Career Peers are paraprofessionals who model professionalism and share expertise gained through a comprehensive training program.

The **Emerging Leadership Program** gives first- and second-year undergraduate students the opportunity to learn about campus life and begin developing their leadership skills. Students participate as a cohort in five weekly events, and then receive access to the Leadership Development Program after completion.

The **Leadership Development Program** (LDP) is designed to help undergraduate students, beginning in their second semester, develop and strengthen their leadership skills. Students gain an understanding of the fundamentals of leadership, apply what they have learned into action, and receive written recognition from Career Services upon program completion. This program has many virtual options and is at a student's own pace.

The **Professional Development Leadership Program** offers undergraduate students in their third and fourth year a foundation for personal and professional success as they prepare for graduation and beyond.

There are so many ways to be a leader on campus from day one by connecting with Campus Activities, joining a club or organization on campus, linking up with a fraternity or sorority, joining hall council, or applying to be a resident assistant.

Career Services also advises chapters of national leadership programs, including the **National Association of Leadership and Success** and **Omicron Delta Kappa**.
