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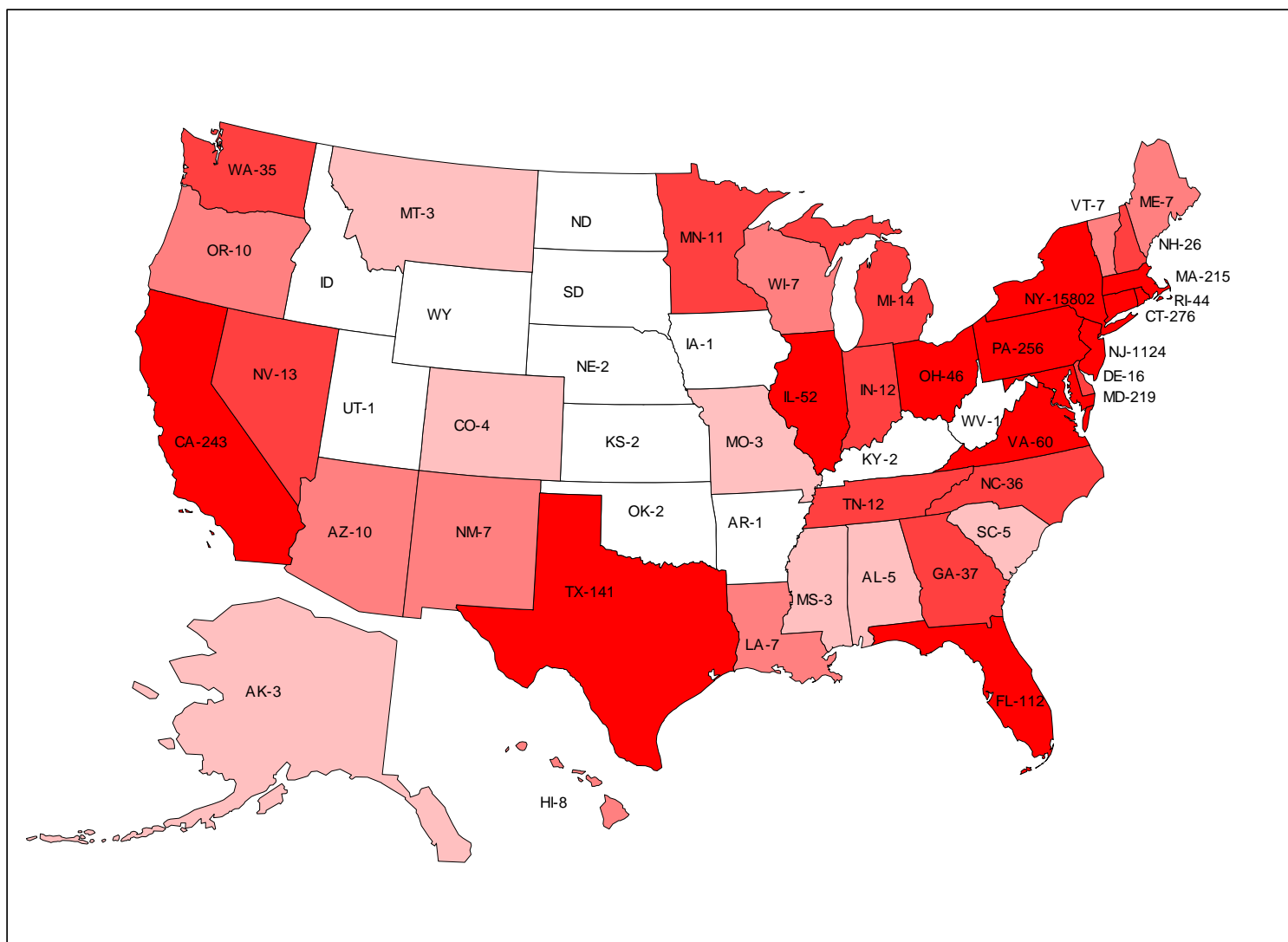

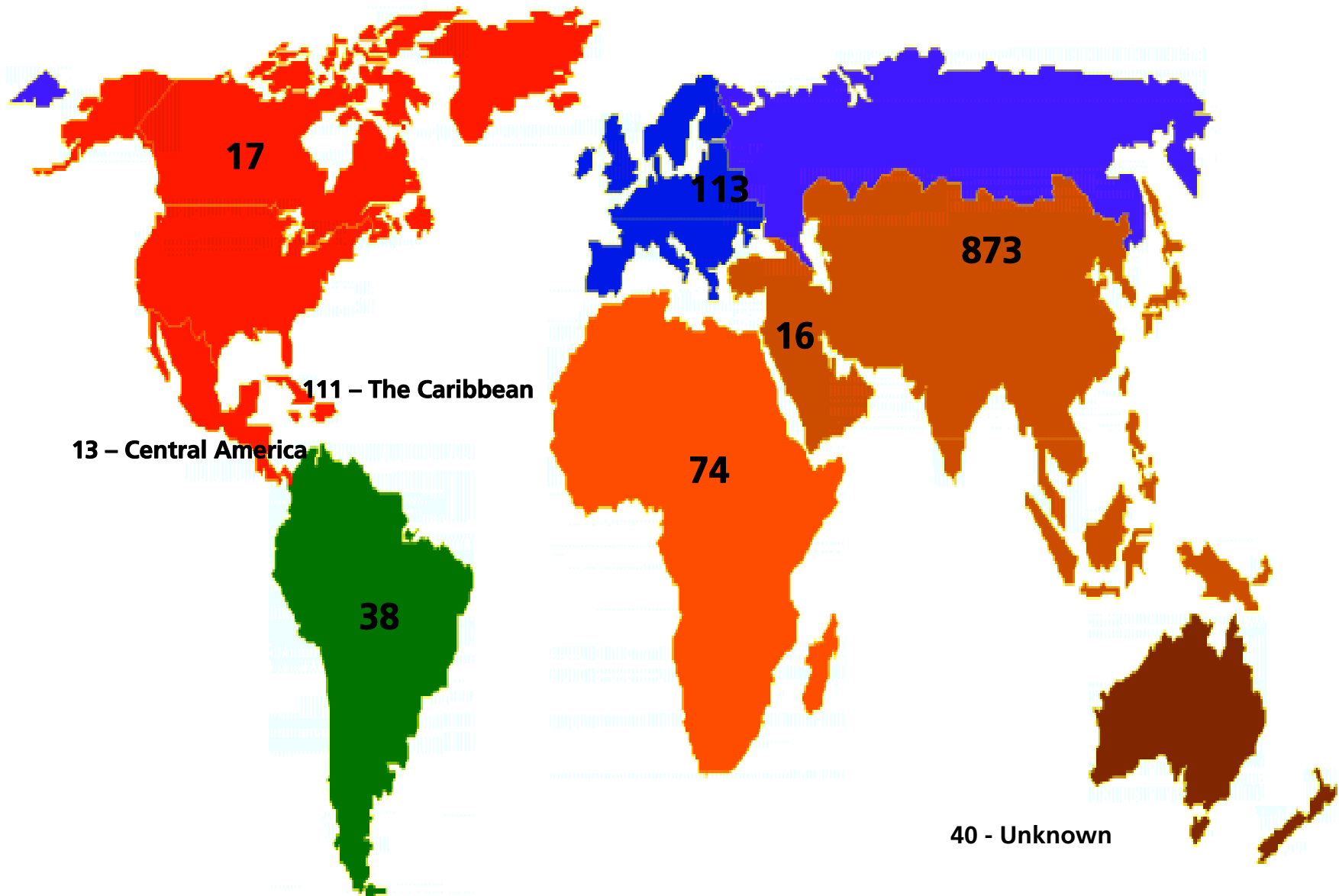

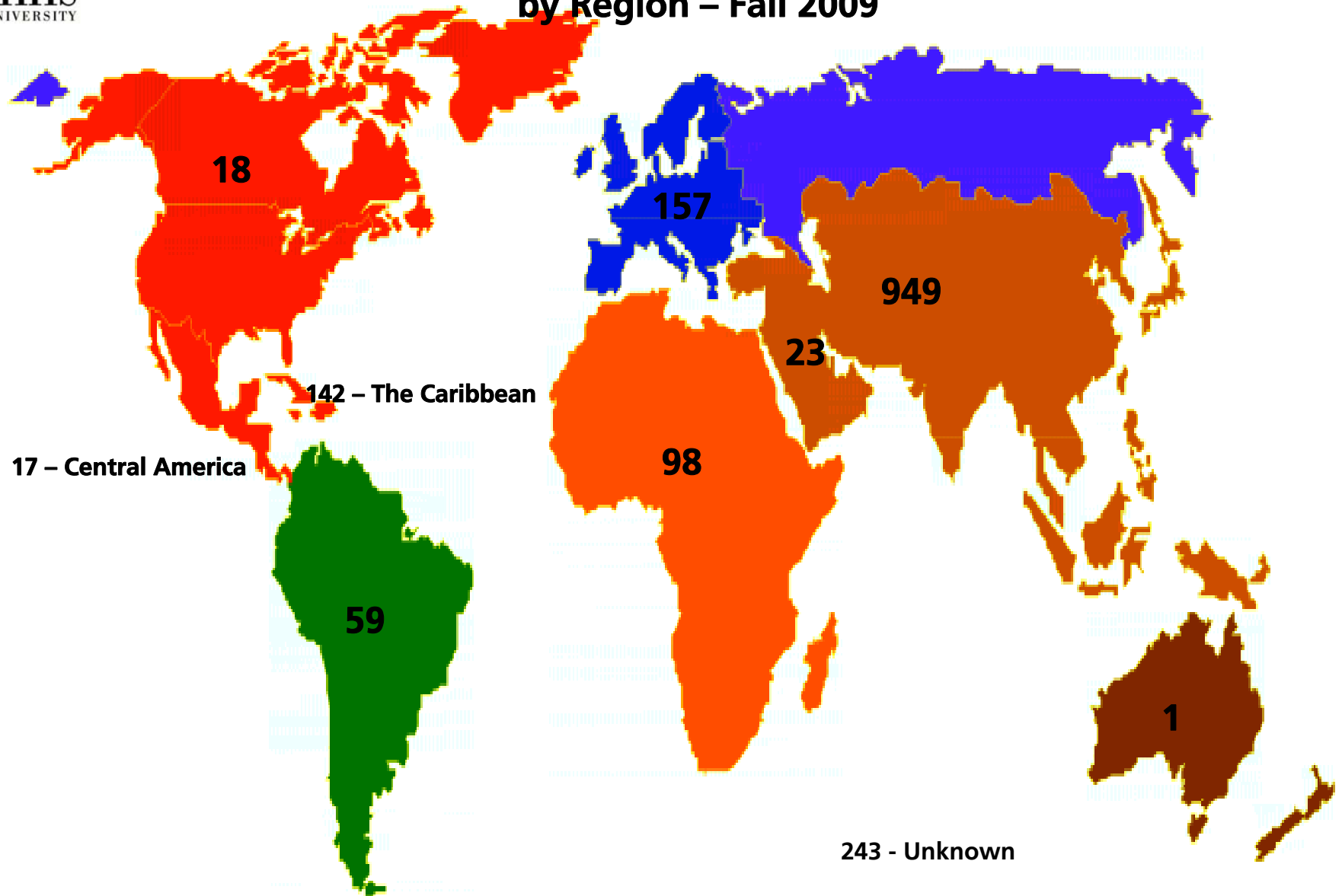
Number of Non-Resident (International) Students by Region – Fall 2009

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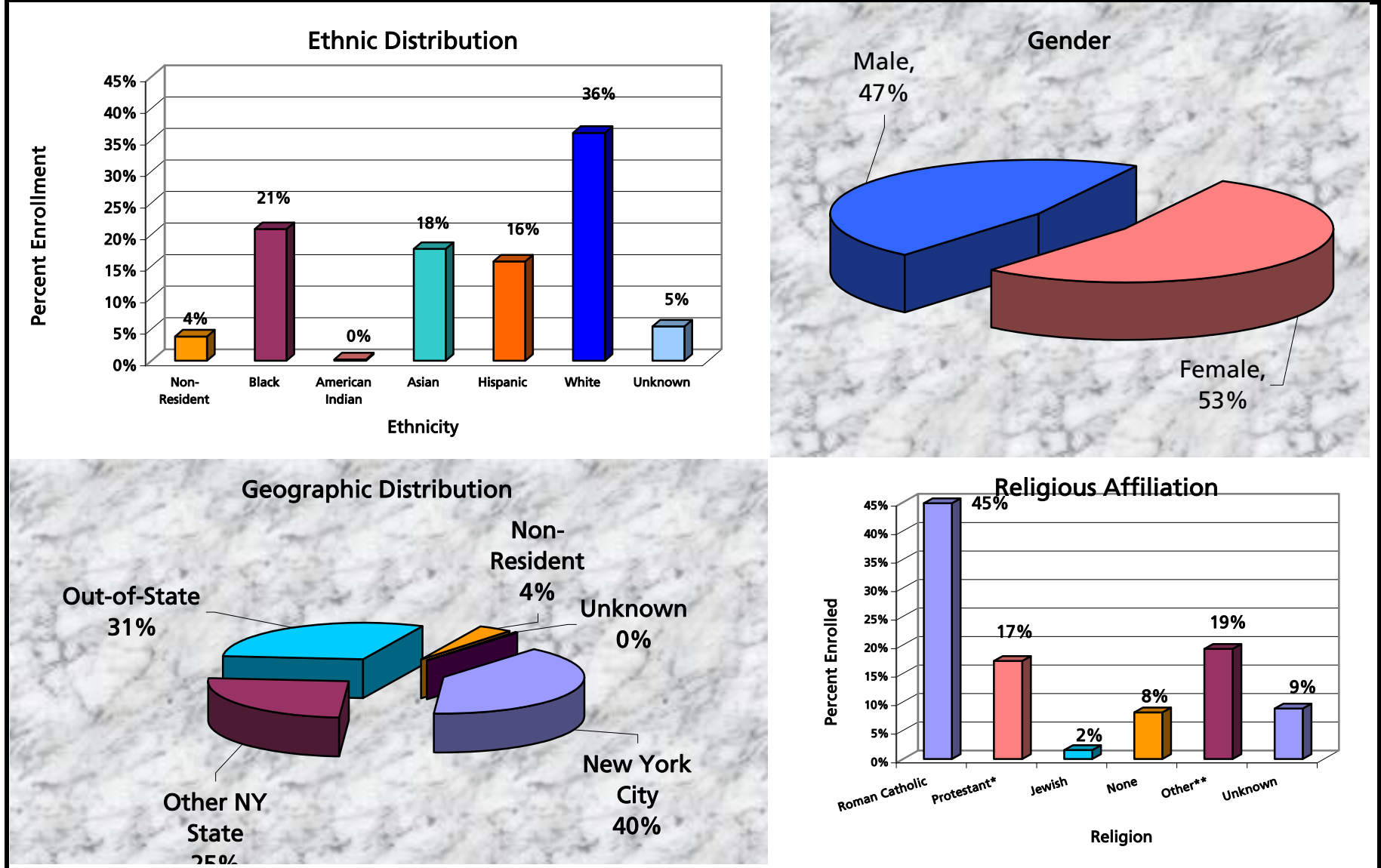

Fall 2009 Freshmen

- *There are 3,108 new freshmen (2,819 – Queens, 254 – Staten Island and 35 - Manhattan).*
- *53% are female and 47% are male.*
- *55% are Black, Asian/Pacific Islander, Hispanic, or American Indian.*
- *45% are Roman Catholic.*
- *The majority of the students (40%) come from New York City. An additional 25% come from other areas of New York State. This is compared to 44% and 26% in Fall 2008, respectively.*
- *Students come from 39 states and the District of Columbia.*
- *Non-residents come from 44 countries.*
- *The mean SAT score for freshman is 1092 compared to 1087 in Fall 2008. This is the highest score ever. The mean HS GPA of 88% is similar to the 87% from last year.*
- *The mean SAT score for freshmen resident students is 1095 and 1087 for commuter students. This is compared to 1091 and 1082, respectively in Fall 2008.*
- *Top majors of Freshmen, excluding Undeclared, are Liberal Studies, Pharmacy, Biology, Psychology, and Physician Assistant.*
- *56% of the Freshmen class live in residence facilities on the Queens, Staten Island, and Manhattan campuses compared to 54% in Fall 2008.*

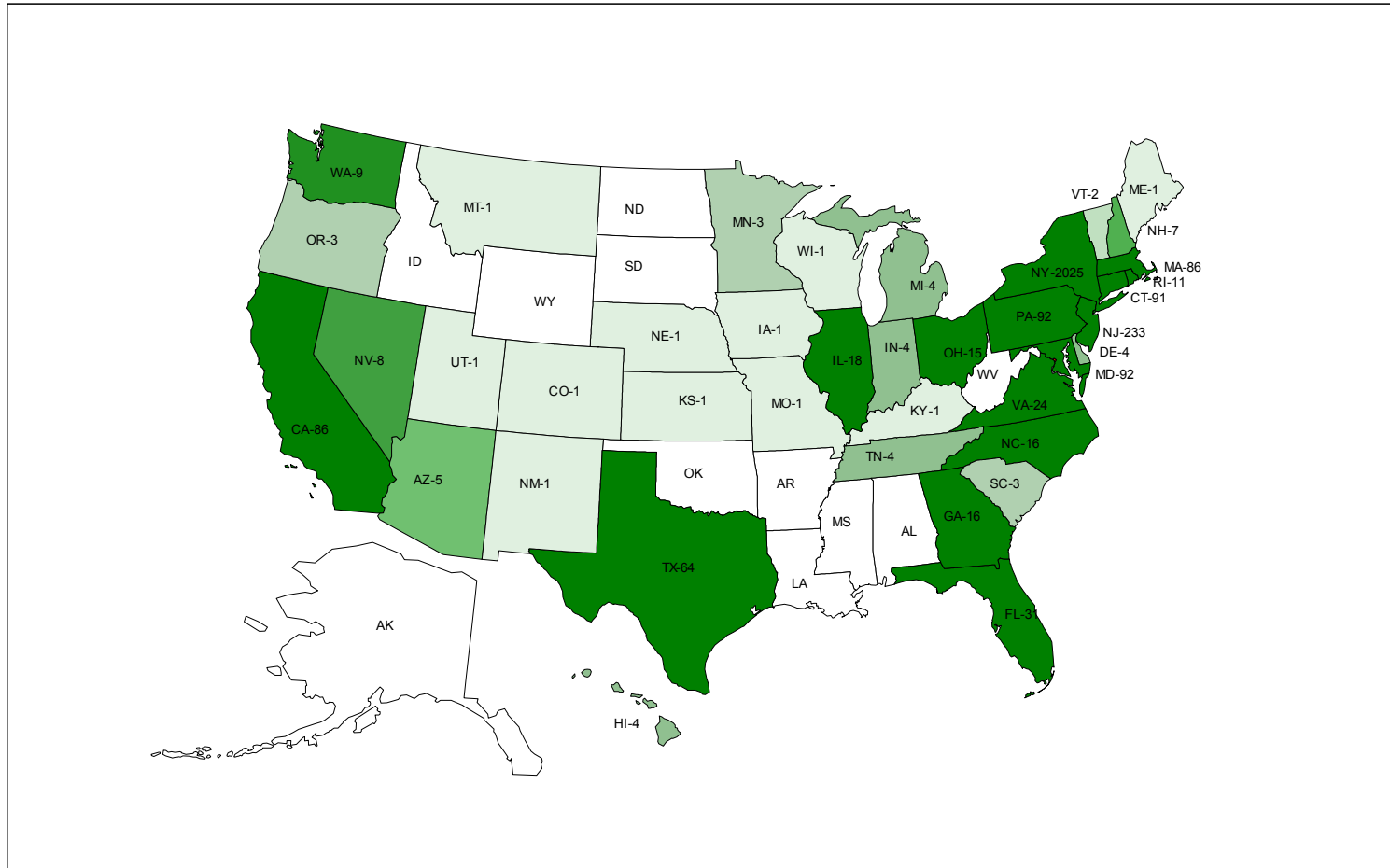

Undergraduate Admission

University

- Total inquiries increased over 30% from 84,822 in 2008 to 111,321 in 2009.
- Total applications and acceptance were at all time highs.
- New freshmen applications continued to increase, more than doubling since 2006, exceeding 52,000 in 2009.
- Secondary market applications continued to increase, more than double the primary market (38,889 vs. 14,091).
- The acceptance rate continued to decline, reflecting our increasing selectivity. In 2009, the acceptance rate is 43%, and in 2000 it was 80%.
- The enrollment rate continued to decrease from 39% in 1999 to 14% in 2009.

Queens Campus

- Total inquiries increased from 81,953 in 2008 to 109,114 in 2009.
- Total applications and acceptance were at all time highs.
- New freshmen applications continued to increase, almost doubling since 2006 and exceeding 40,000 in 2009 for the first time.
- The acceptance rate continued to decline from 80% in 2000 to 44% in 2009.
- The enrollment rate continued to decrease almost 50%, from 27% in 2004 to 14% in 2009.

Staten Island Campus

- New freshmen applications continued to increase, more than tripling since 2007, exceeding 8,000 in 2009.
- The acceptance rate continued to decrease from 82% in 2000 to 34% in 2009.
- The enrollment rate decreased almost 50% from 17% in 2008 to 9% in 2009.

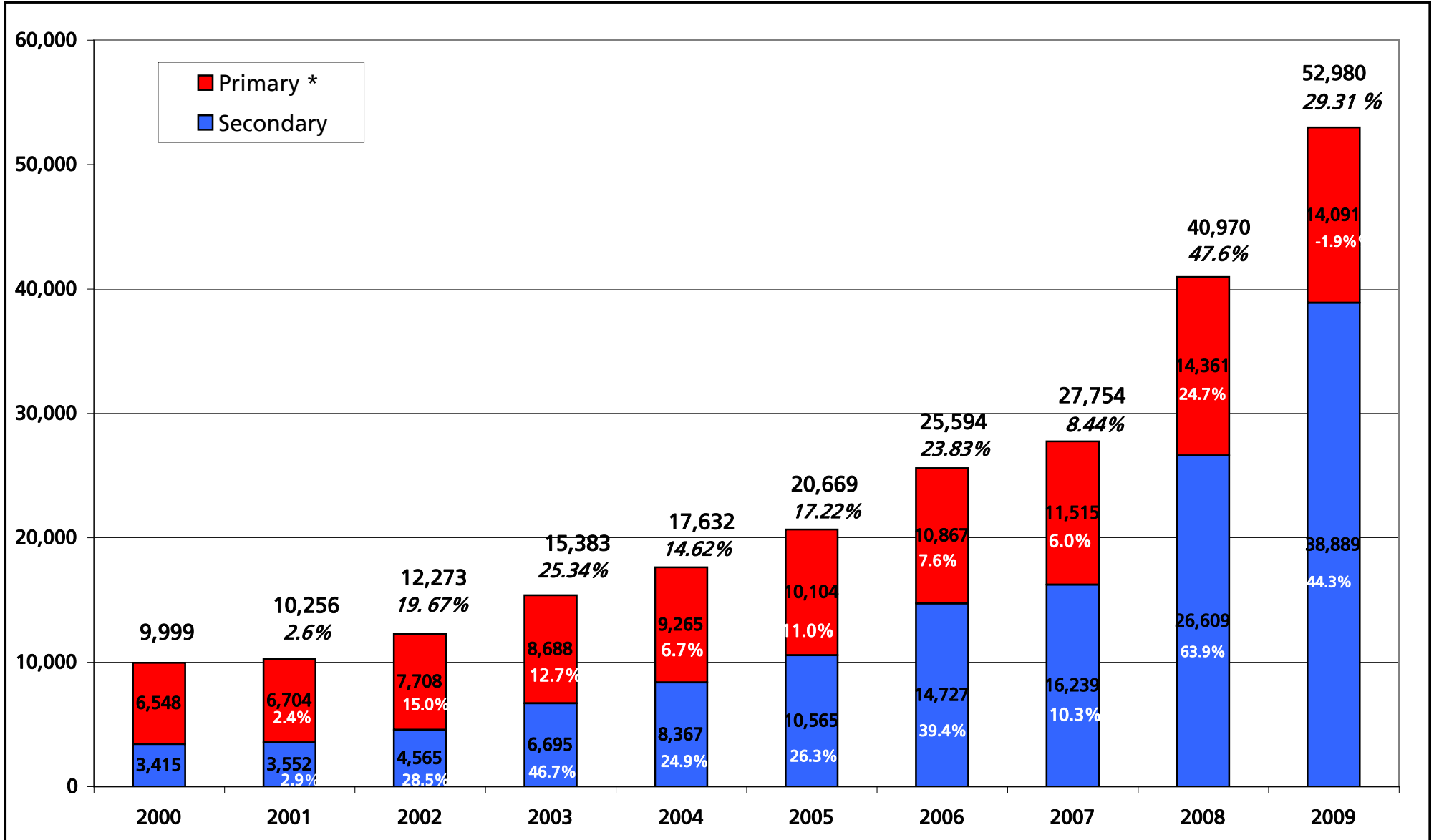

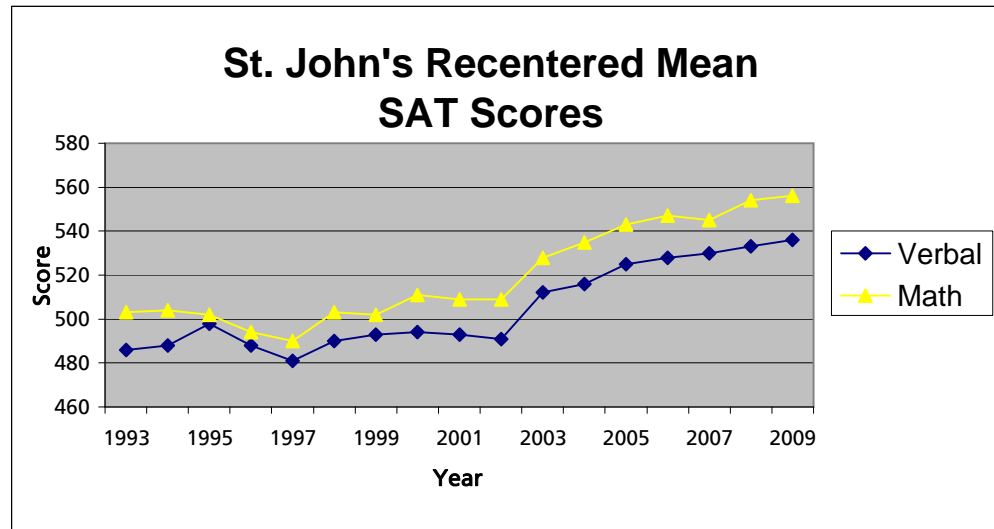

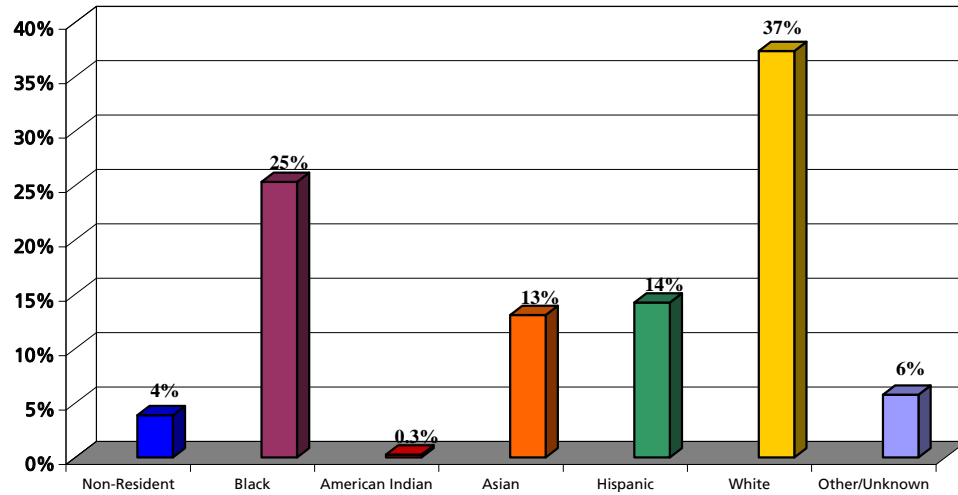

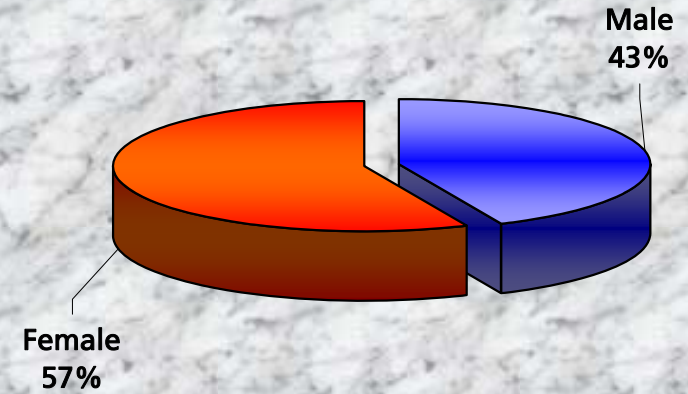

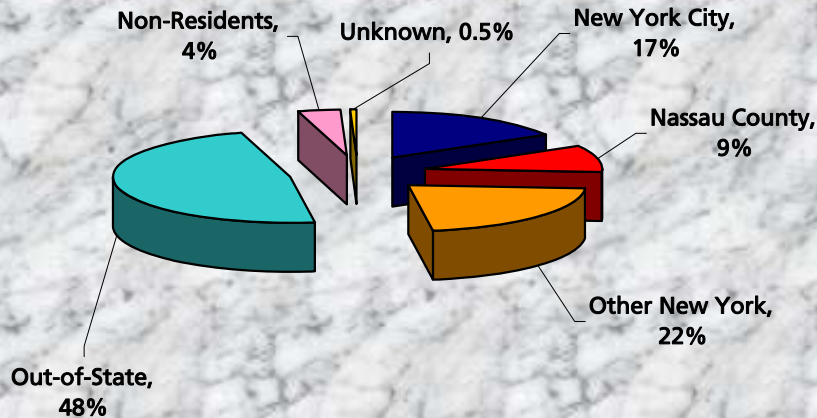
Ethnic Distribution



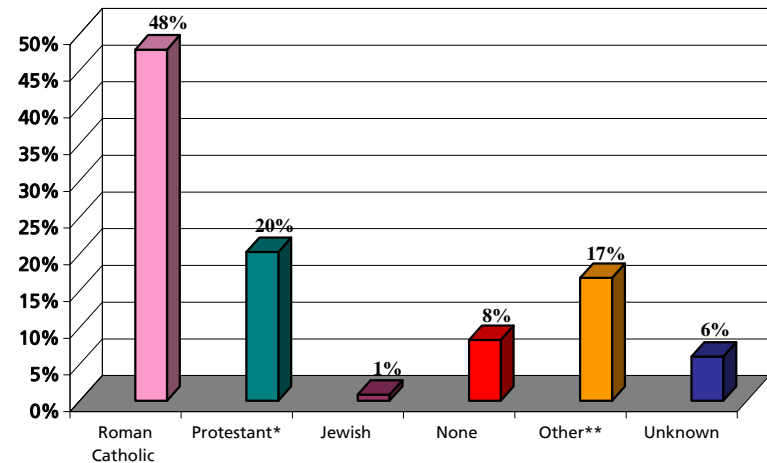

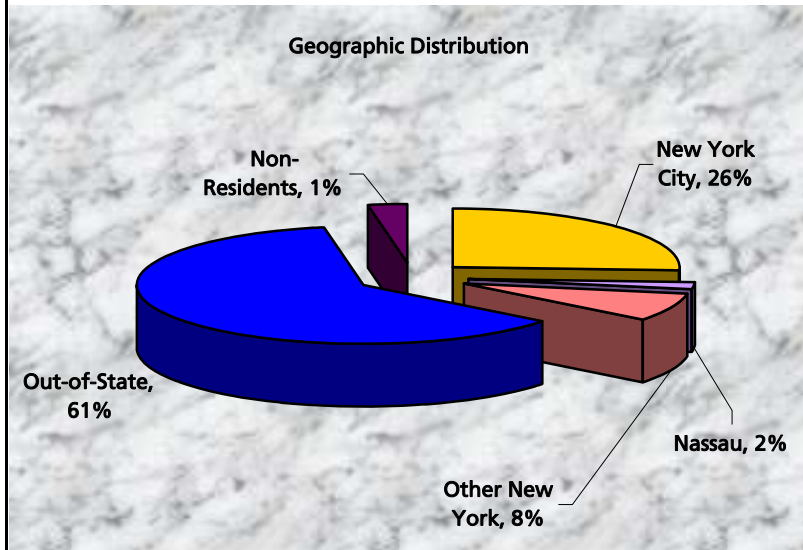
Ethnic Distribution



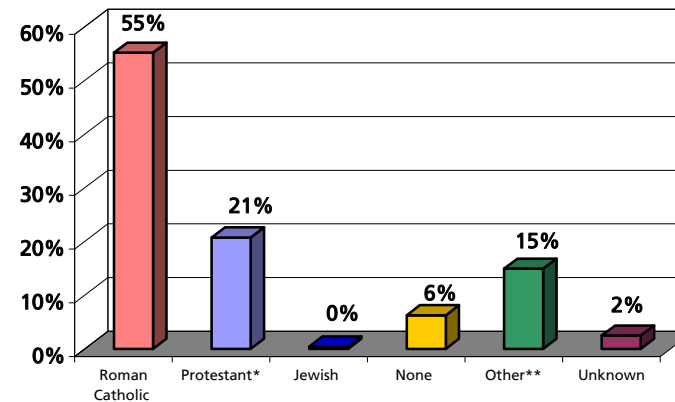

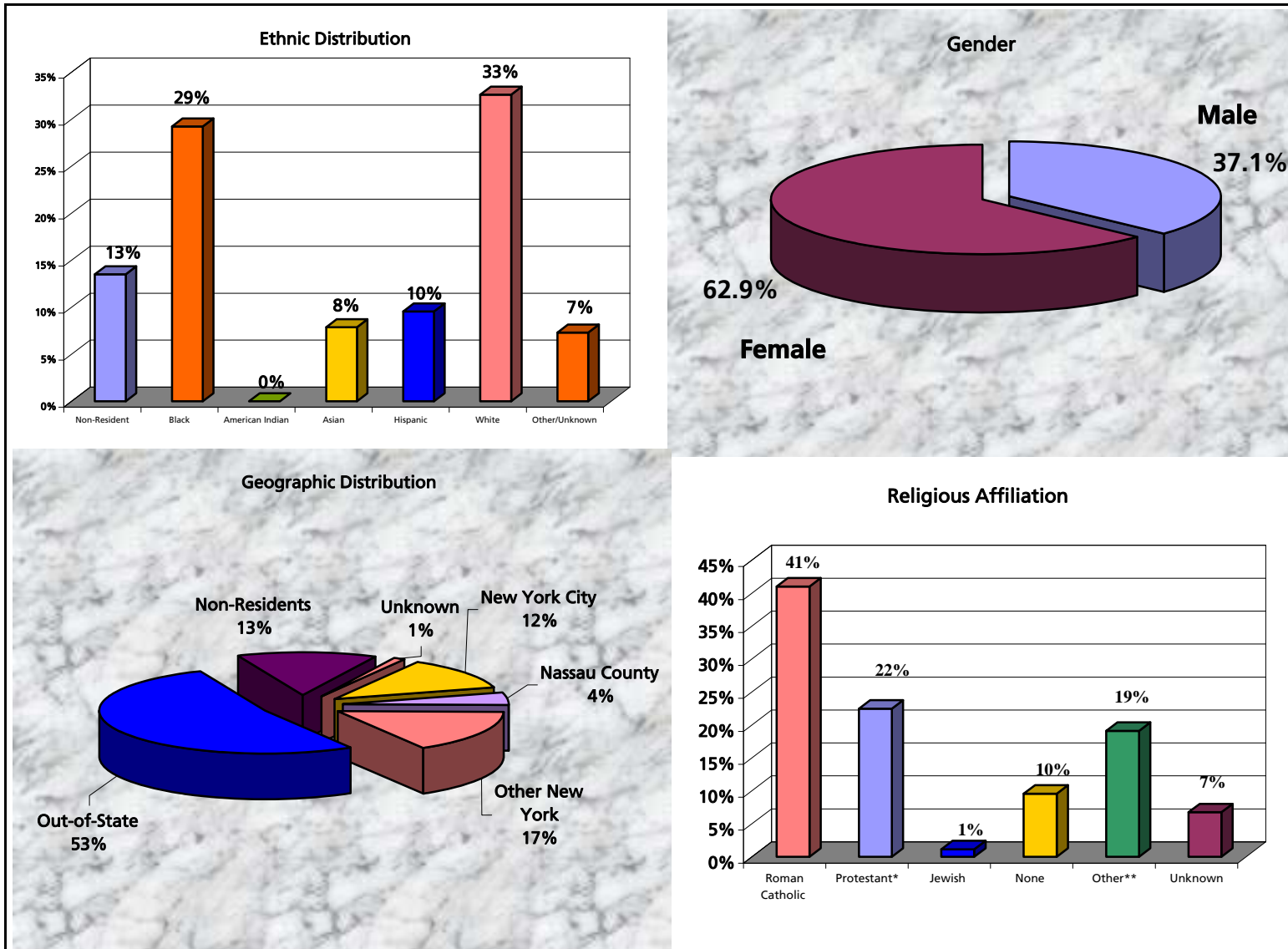

2008-2009 Degrees Conferred

- *There were 4,036 degrees conferred in the 2008-2009 academic year. This is compared to 3,925 in 2007-2008. Degrees were awarded at the associate, baccalaureate, master, doctoral, law, and other first professional level. Post master's diplomas and undergraduate certificates were also awarded.*
- *Fifty-four percent of the graduates were baccalaureates. This remained the same from 2007-2008.*
- *Twenty-eight percent were master's, the same as in 2007-2008.*
- *Seven percent were JD law graduates, which remained the same from 2007-2008.*
- *Ninty-eight doctoral degrees were conferred with more than half of them being conferred in St. John's College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. This is compared to 57 in 2007-2008.*
- *Sixty percent of our graduates were female compared to 61% in 2007-2008.*
- *Thirty-seven percent of our graduates were Black, Hispanic, American Indian, or Asian compared to 39% in 2007-2008.*

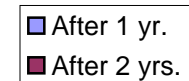
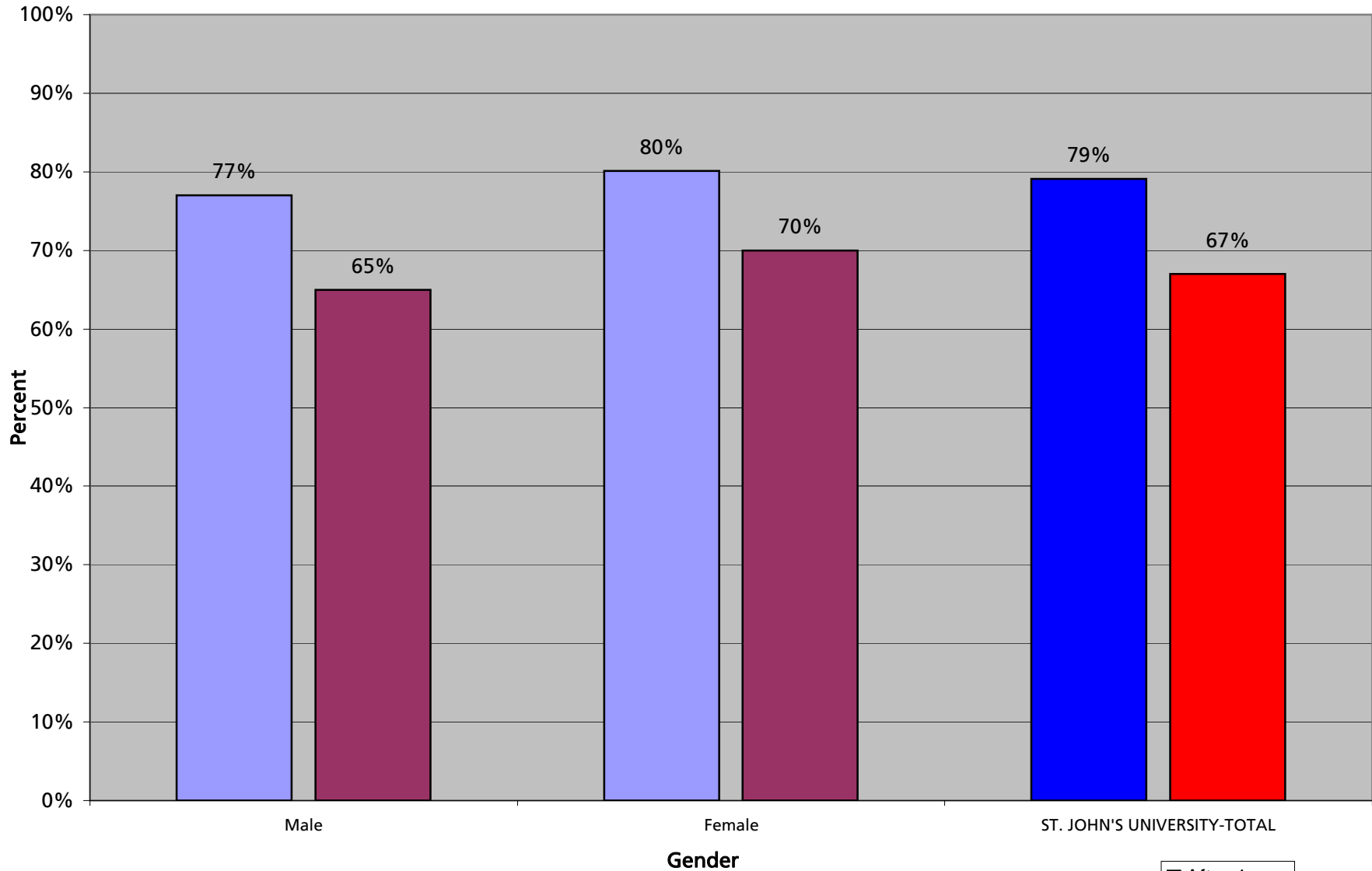

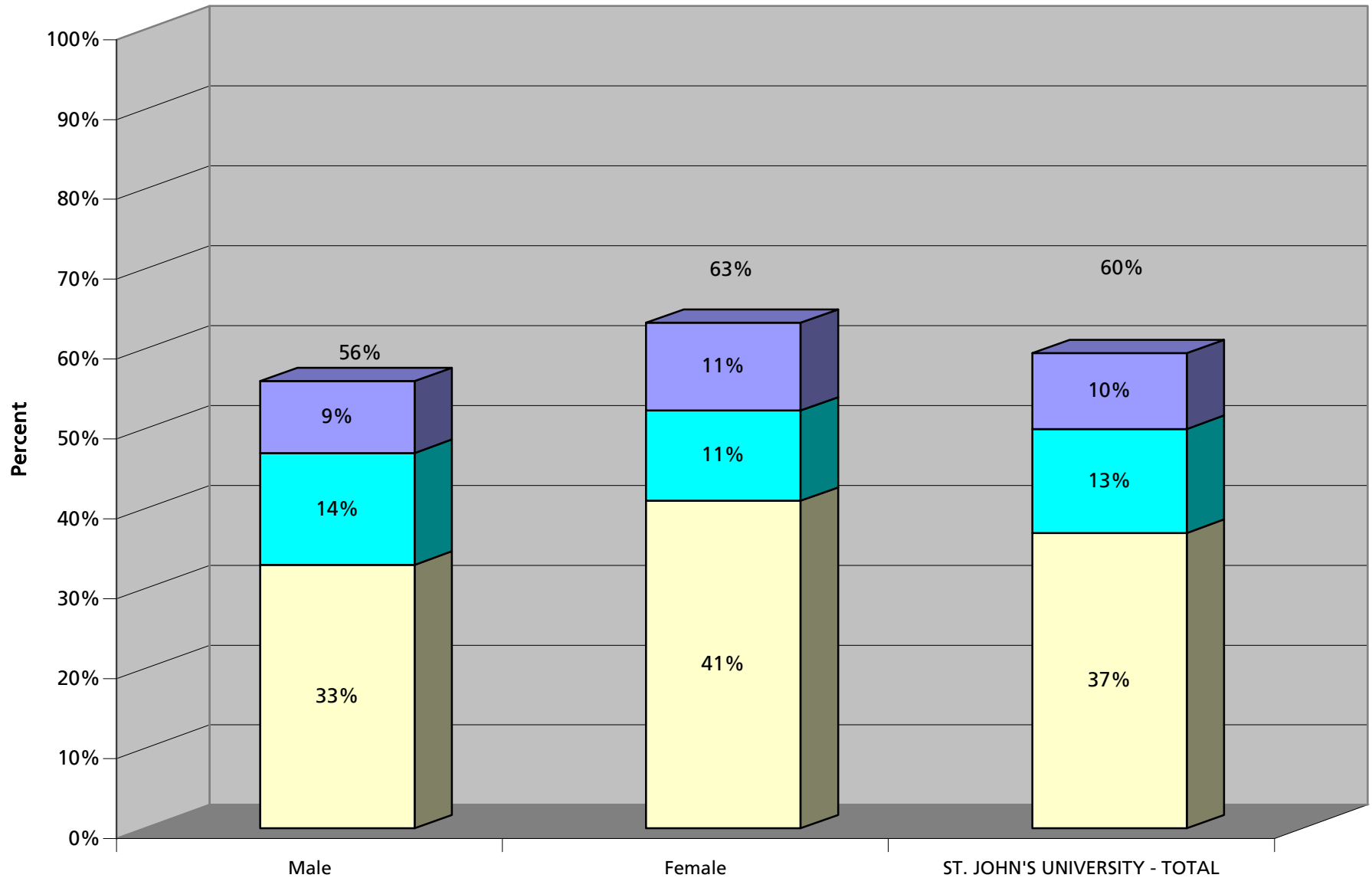

2001 - 2005

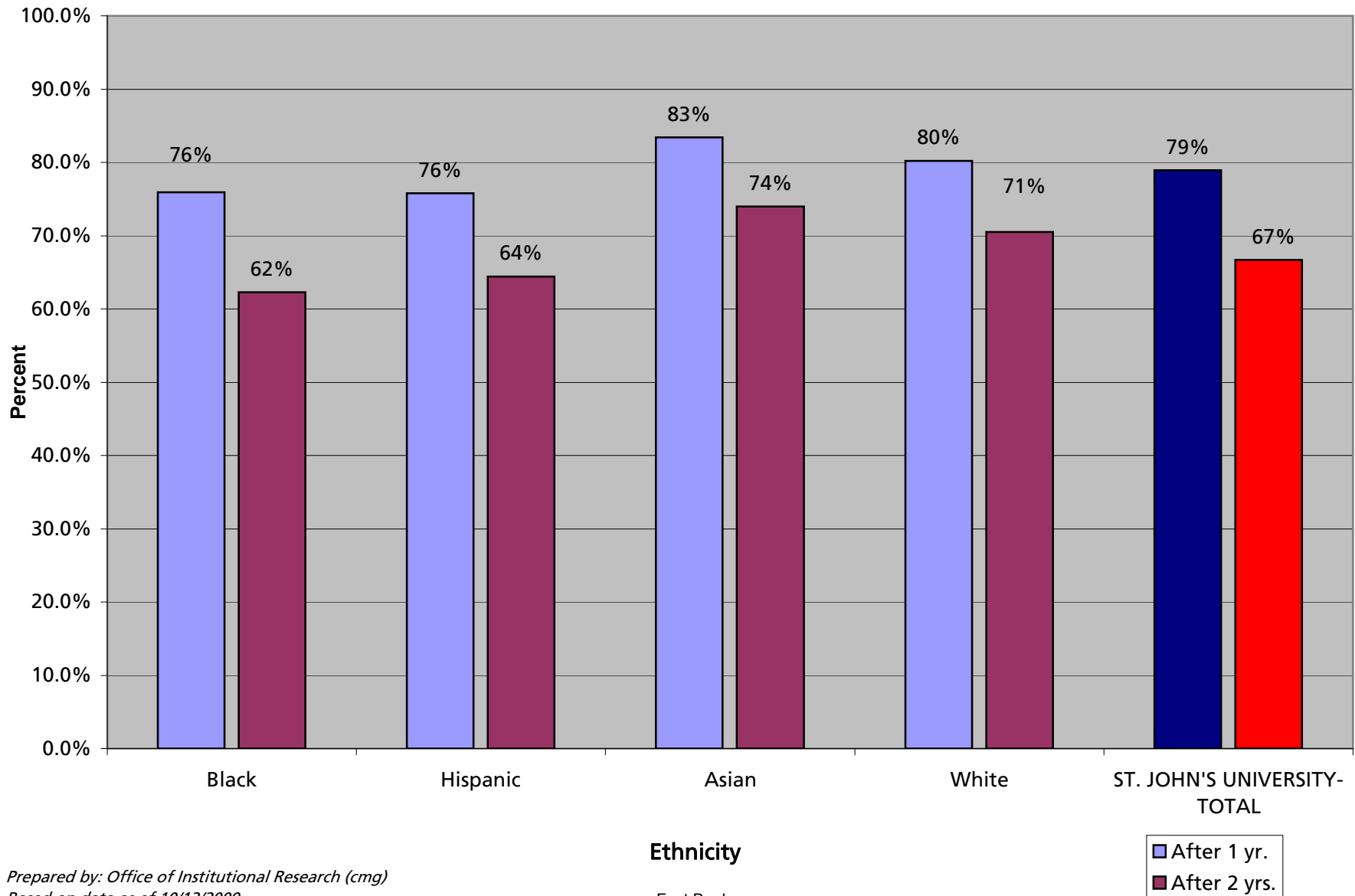

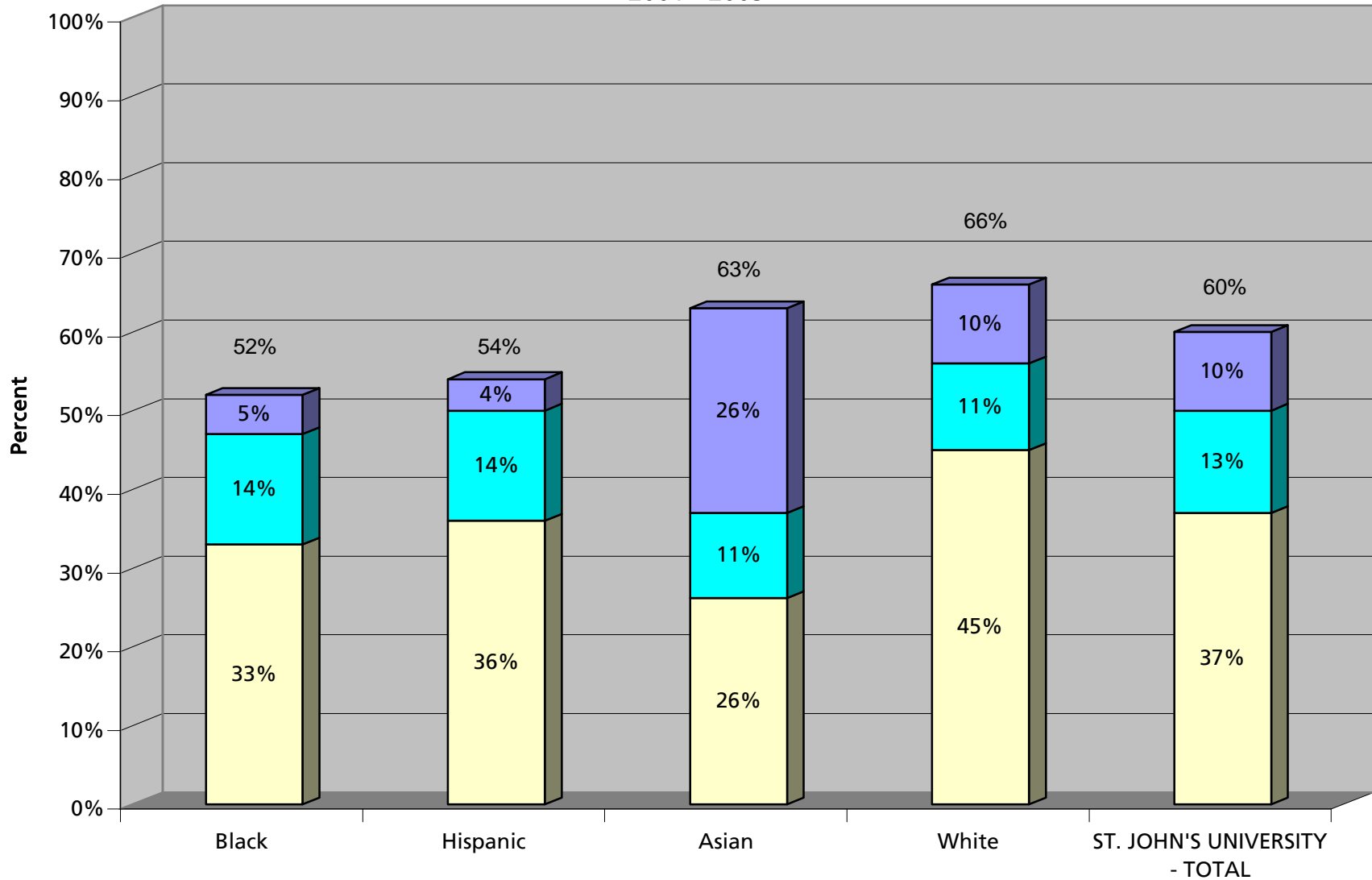
Composite Retention Rates
